Roles in Traceability

GOVERNMENT:

The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) creates and enforces the National Livestock Identification Regulations under Part XV of the Health of Animals Act.

INDUSTRY:

Industry administers the program.

There are 3 responsible administrators in Canada:

- Agri-Traçabilité Quebec (ATQ)
- PigTrace
- Canadian Cattle Identification Agency (CCIA)



Who is CCIA?

(Canadian Cattle Identification Agency)

RESPONSIBLE ADMINISTRATOR:

A not-for-profit, industry-initiated and led organization incorporated to establish a national livestock identification program and traceability initiatives to support efficient trace back and containment of serious animal health and food safety concerns.

CANADIAN LIVESTOCK TRACKING SYSTEM (CLTS):

The CLTS database allows producers to record tag information pertaining to the three pillars of traceability (i.e., animal identification, premises identification and movement), as well as value-added information (e.g., age verification).



CCIA's Decision Makers



The agency is led by a Board of Directors representing 16 industry associations from all sectors of the livestock industry in Canada.

Our main responsibilities

- 1. Database (CLTS)**
Protect the security and integrity of Part XV data, in accordance with privacy restrictions.
- 2. Everything Animal indicators (tags)**
Recommendations, manage the numbers, distribution/sales, complaints, manufacturers relationship
- 3. Communicate regulatory interpretations**
and proposed regulatory amendments to regulated parties.



Privacy Act

Part XV of the Health of Animals Regulations

Information submitted to the (CLTS) database is protected under the Privacy Act and is in accordance with privacy restrictions imposed by CFIA in its agreement with CCIA.



Current Regulations

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION:

All cattle/sheep/bison must be tagged with an approved indicator prior to moving from their current location or leaving their farm of origin.

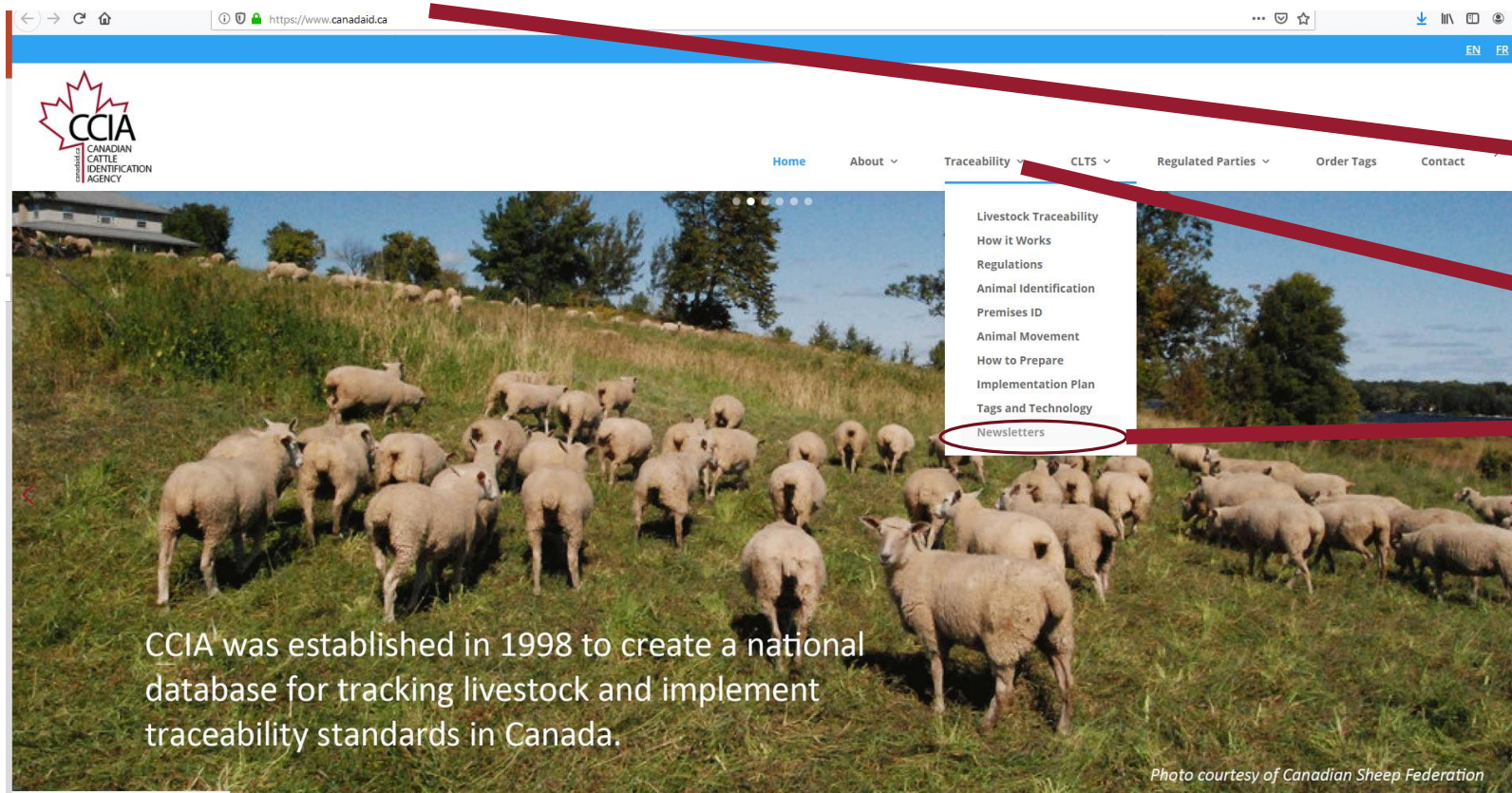
REQUIREMENTS FOR ABATTOIRS:

Cattle and bison: Mandatory reporting of the identification number within 30 days of the animal's death or slaughter.

Expected proposed amendments

MOVEMENT REPORTING (animals leaving a premises)

Animals would travel with a movement document.
The document would include:

- Premises Identification (PID) of departure and PID of destination
- Time and date of loading
- License plate or conveyance identification
- Number of animals and species



Expected proposed amendments (2)

MOVEMENT REPORTING (animals arriving at a premises)

The destination site would be responsible for reporting the arrival of animals:

- Including individual indicator numbers
- **Some exemptions:** Auction Markets, Assembly Yards, Community Pastures



What else you should know?

- Built on existing provincial regulations and tools i.e. manifest
- The document can be electronic or paper (no regulated form)
- PID number would be necessary to purchase animal indicators (tags).





Expected timeline

- Draft regulations publication in Canada Gazette, Part 1 targeted for 2020
- 75 days public comment period, followed by review (up to 12 months)
- Canada Gazette, Part 2 (in force) in 2021 (??)



How to get ready:

1. Get a PID

- Inform CCIA of your PID

2. Visit your CLTS account

- Include your PID number
- Submit retirements
- Practice animal move-in

3. Stay tuned for proposed regulation publishing (Canada Gazette)

- Offer comments during the comment period

The other way to access the CLTS **CLTS MOBO app**

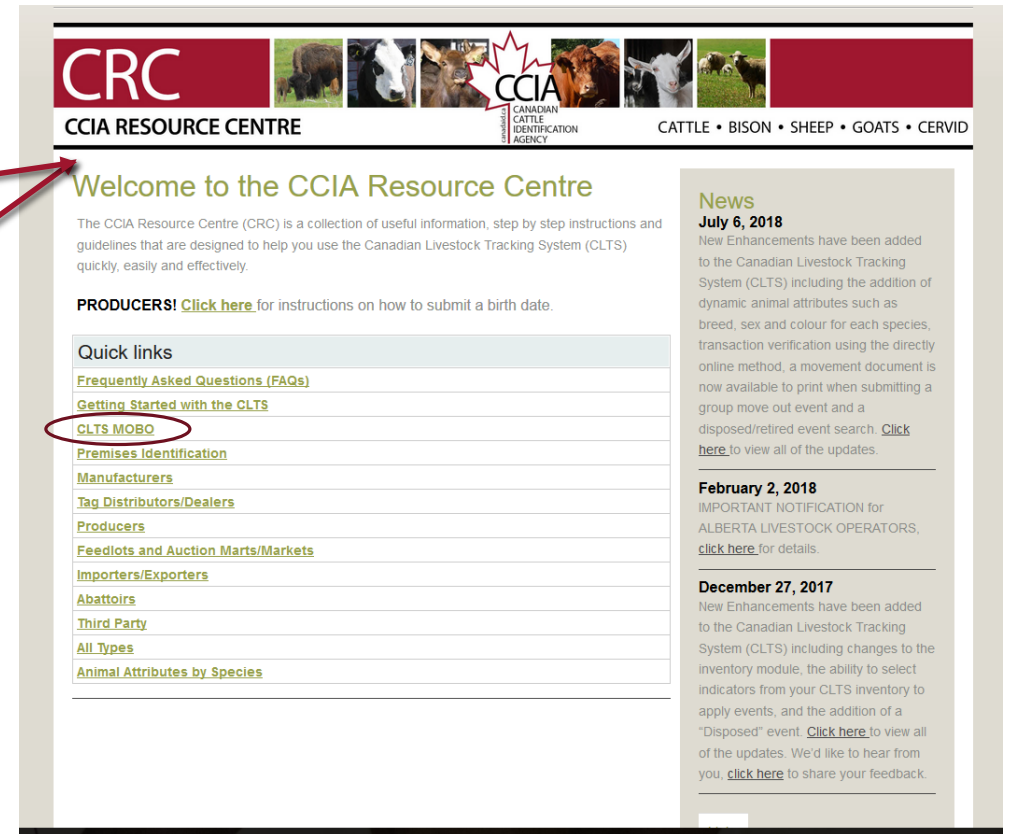
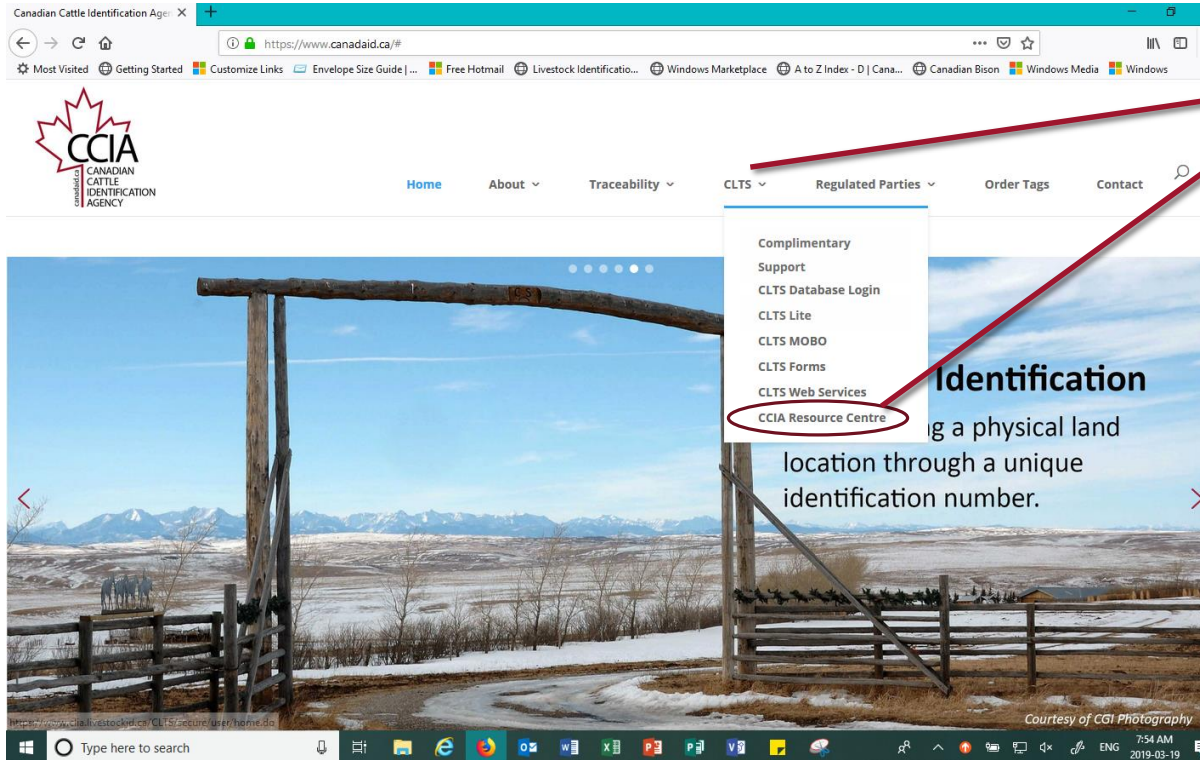
- iPhone or Android
